**Title:** An ecological approach to ergonomic problems.

**Abstract:** It will be argued that ecological psychology provides a principled approach to an integrated framework for ergonomics. As such, it is applicable to a wide range of ergonomic problems. Such an integrated approach is needed to deal with problems of fractionation of human factors/ergonomics --e.g., statements which appear in the literature that usability has nothing to do with physical ergonomics, and that HCI is not part of ergonomics. Specific research examples will be provided.
